HOT CHICKEN SALAD CASSEROLE

INGREDIENTS:

- 1. 3 cups cubed cooked chicken breast
- 2. 2 stalks celery, sliced
- 3. 1 large yellow pepper, chopped
- 4. 3/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 5. 1 10.75 oz cream of chicken soup
- 6. 16 oz plain low-fat yogurt
- 7. 2 green onions sliced
- 8. 1 TBS lemon juice
- 9. 1/4 tsp black pepper
- 10. 1/2 cup crushed cornflakes
- 11. 1/4 cup sliced almonds



Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400. In a large bowl, stir together chicken, celery, pepper, cheese, soup, yogurt, green onions, lemon juice and black pepper. Transfer to a 2-quart rectangular baking dish.
- 2. In a small bowl, stir together conrflakes and almonds. Sprinkle evenly over chicken mixture.
- 3. Bake uncovered about 30 minutes or until heated through. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.


